## **ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN**

- 1. The Government of Nepal (the Recipient) is implementing the Forests for Prosperity Project (the Project), with the involvement of the following ministries/units: Ministry of Forests and Environment (MoFE); REDD Implementation Center (REDD IC); Forests for Prosperity Project Management Unit (PMU); Ministries of Industry, Tourism, Forest and Environment (MoITFE) of Provincial Governments 2 and 5 and their respective Provincial Project Management Units (PPMUs); and selected Local Governments (municipalities) within Provinces 2 and 5 as set out in the Loan Agreement, Grant Agreement, and the Project Agreement. The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the World Bank), acting as the administrator of Strategic Climate Fund Trust Fund and ProGREEN Trust Fund, has agreed to provide the original financing (P170798) and additional financing (P181002) for the Project, as set out in the referred agreement(s). This ESCP supersedes previous versions of the ESCP for the Project and shall apply both to the original and the additional financing for Project referred to above.
- 2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Loan Agreement, Grant Agreement, and the Project Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement(s).
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the [Recipient] shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring, and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the [World Bank/Bank/Association]. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the World Bank.
- 4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Government of Nepal, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient through Ministry of Forests and Environment (MoFE); REDD Implementation Center (REDD IC); Forests for Prosperity Project Management Unit (PMU); Ministries of Industry, Tourism, Forest and Environment (MoITFE) of Provincial Governments 2 and 5 and their respective Provincial Project Management Units (PPMUs); and selected Local Governments (municipalities) within Provinces 2 and 5 and the World Bank agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and the Recipient Mr. Nabaraj Pudasaini, Joint Secretary and Chief of REDD Implementation Centre, Ministry of Forests and Environment. The Borrower shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
